Compare also, vs. 11 and vs. 14)

- b) What did the Pharisees “accuse” the disciples of Jesus of doing? (They “accused” them of doing that “which is not lawful to do on the Sabbath days,” vs. 2. It should be noted, however, that their accusation was false. Compare, Matthew 12:7)
- c) What Old Testament hero did Jesus refer to when correcting these hypocritical Pharisees? (David, vs. 3-4)
- d) What was wrong with the man’s right hand that Jesus healed on the Sabbath day? (It was withered, vs. 6)
- e) What did Jesus do in a mountain “all night?” (The text says, “He went out into a mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God,” vs. 12)
- f) What verse says, “...Blessed are ye that weep now: for ye shall laugh?” (Luke 6:21)
- g) What verse says, “...Woe unto you that laugh now! For ye shall mourn and weep?” (Luke 6:25)
