In other words, if a brother has sinned against you, you should lovingly confront and correct the error. If he repents, you should readily forgive him. Also, vs. 4 makes it clear that you are not to keep score and/or limit your willingness to forgive to only a set number of times, etc.)
- d) Luke 17:10 says, “So likewise ye, when ye shall have _____ all those things which are _____ you, say, We are _____ servants: we have done that which was our _____ to do.” (done; commanded; unprofitable; duty)
- e) As Jesus went into “a certain village,” how many lepers did He meet? (Ten lepers, vs. 12)

- b) What does the phrase, “I trow not,” mean, as found in Luke 17:9? (It means, “I think not” or I don’t think so, etc.)
- c) When the lepers came to Jesus, did they touch his garments? (No. The text says that they “stood afar off,” vs. 12)
- d) What was the nationality of the leper that remembered to thank Jesus? (He was a Samaritan, vs. 16)
- e) Referencing Himself, in what verse does Jesus say, “But first must He suffer many things, and be rejected of this generation?” (Luke 17:25)
- f) Even as dreadfully sinful as the conditions were in Noah’s day, what does Jesus imply about the existence or non-existence of marriage during his day? Put differently, is there a lesson for us regarding the reference by Jesus to the existence of marriage during Noah’s day? (Yes there is a lesson here. Jesus implies that marriage DID at least (in some manner) still exist during the days of Noah. In other words, even though the works of mankind at that time were so vile and wicked that God destroyed the world with a flood (save 8 souls), even then, the society still recognized some type of ordinance regarding marriage. Jesus said of Noah’s day, “...they married wives, they were given in marriage,” etc. The point is this: If God destroyed the world with a global flood because of their extreme wickedness even though they accepted in some way or manner “marriage,” what must God think of our modern society that is steadily rejecting the concept of marriage, opting for “living together,” “alternative lifestyles,” etc.????, vs. 27)
